GOATS

- ☐ bucket of oats
- ☐ bucket of barley
- ☐ bucket of peas
- ☐ bucket of BOSS
- ☐ molasses jar
- ☐ mineral feeder of kelp
- ☐ mineral feeder of baking soda
- ☐ mineral feeder of Sweetlix
- ☐ all empty buckets
- ☐ alfalfa bale
- ☐ grass hay bale
- ☐ straw bale
- ☐ feed scoop
- ☐ leashes
- ☐ one large kennel for each buck
- ☐ pocket knife or hoof trimmers
- ☐ medical tote (gather from barn and fridge as well)
- ☐ tarp
- ☐ garbage bags
- ☐ pitchfork
- ☐ herdbook
- ☐ baby wipes (if milking)
- ☐ milking bucket (if milking)
- ☐ plug-in travel cooler for meds (and milk if needed)
- ☐ small kennels for small kids (if we have)
- ☐ bottles and nipples (if we have kids)
- ☐ milk (if we have kids)

If extremely urgent, grab empty buckets, herdbook, and animals only

Tarp and leashes in case we need to shelter out of the trailer/truck

CHICKENS

- ☐ waterer
- ☐ full feeder
- ☐ bucket of feed mix
- ☐ enough kennels for all birds

Chickens are last, in case they must be left behind (open coop and all gates)

1. grain in feeders and lock goats and chickens in barns (easier to catch)
2. reach out to a farm contact for temporary shelter
3. kennels set up in truck bed
4. all bucks in kennels
5. young kids in small kennels (if we have kids)
6. ratchet kennels in the truck bed
7. trailer hooked to truck
8. all does in trailer
9. ratchet kennels in the truck bed
10. chickens in kennels and ratcheted
11. load up supplies

Animals loaded first, then supplies (we can buy supplies if needed)
